With the application form, please enclose:

- *a copy of your passport*
- *a transcript from the Registrar, a degree diploma or the like to document your level of study*
- *a short description of your motivation for applying including the relevance of the summer school for your individual study program, project and research interests (max. 200 words, to be used if there are more than 25 applicants - see below)*

Directions for the Application Form

Ad 2. If you are applying for admission at Master level, you must hold a bachelor's degree or a minimum of 180 ECTS in your study programme. Students applying for admission at Bachelor level must have completed at least one and a half year (minimum 90 ECTS) of study in a relevant subject.

If you apply as BA-student you must have a minimum of 90 ECTS in a relevant BA study programme (archaeology, art history, classical philology, history, literature, modern languages or related disciplines).

If you apply as a Ph.D. student please document:

- your Ph.D. relation to your home university
- the relevance of your course application related to your Ph.D. programme

International students: If you enrol as an Erasmus exchange student at Aarhus University for the entire duration of the course (spring semester 2012), you do not have to pay a participation fee, as long as the course can be transferred into your study programme at your home university (see section 6 in the Application Form).

Ad 3. Preliminary indication of study focus. Prior to the two weeks in Rome you will be expected to study relevant literature and begin working on your exam paper. You will be assigned a supervisor who will help you form a thesis statement. You will also be able to consult your supervisor during the stay in Rome. From 1 May you will have access to the primary texts for the course modules. For descriptions of the individual modules, please see the Preliminary programme on the course web page.

Ad 4. Accommodation. We offer to convey accommodation at the Danish, Swedish or Finnish Academy in Rome at a fairly low rate. As the rates are set by the individual institutions they will differ (single room max €35/night, shared room max €23/night). There are a few single rooms available, but in order to offer accommodation for all participants most rooms will have to be shared by two or more persons. We will get back to you with a detailed proposition (including price).

Ad. 5. If you wish to have the Summer School credited towards your degree, it is required that you get an authorised representative from your home university to sign a pre-approval of credit transfer. This applies to international students as well as students from other Danish universities.

Language requirements

The language of teaching is English.

Applicants to the summer school are expected:

- to have a good command of the English language
- to be able to read the relevant literature (may – according to chosen subject – include German, French, Italian and Latin)

Response

All applicants will be informed about the admission decision on 1 April.

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If the number of applicants exceeds the total number of seats (25), the admission decision will be based on the relevance of the summer school for the student's individual study programme, project and research interests; the selected group will be composed of Bachelor as well as Master and Ph.D. students.

Students admitted to the Summer School will receive detailed information about the programme, reading list, admission to course literature and other practical matters during Spring 2012.
